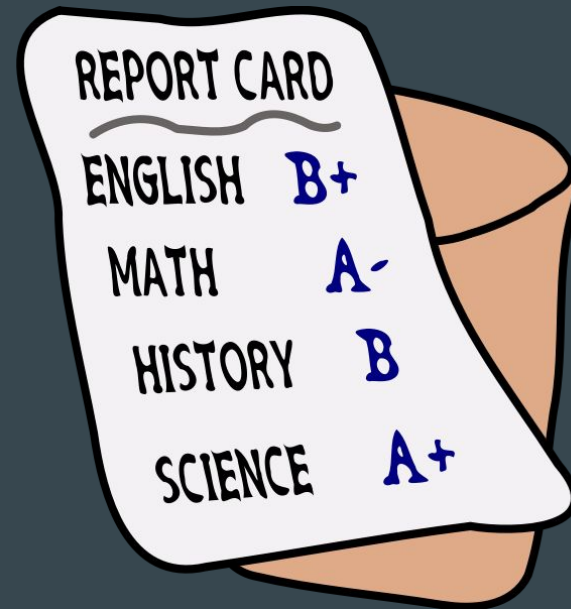

Grade Advancement/Credits

- Credit System-In order to receive a credit, you must pass a class (60% or higher)
- 5 Credits-Sophomore (10th Gr)
- 10 Credits-Junior (11th Gr)
- 15 Credits-Senior (12th Gr)
- 21 Credits-Graduate!

Class of 2021 and 2022 - Grad Req

Your classes have two options for meeting the state of Ohio's grad requirements:

OPTION 1

Step 1 - Earn 21 Credits

Step 2 - 18 points on 7 End of Course Ohio State Tests
(Eng I, Eng II, Alg I, Geom, Biol, US Studies, Am Gov't)

OPTION 2

Step 1 - Earn 21 Credits

Step 2 - Earn Competency in English
and Math on the Ohio State Tests

Step 3 - Earn 2 Diploma Seals

Athletic Eligibility



OHSAA - Ohio High School Athletic Association

- Enrolled in five courses to equal 5 credits yearly
- Physical Education classes do not count as one of the five
- Passing classes with a 60% average (D-)
- Preceding quarter (nine weeks) grade point average of 1.65

NCAA - National Collegiate Athletic Association

- Student athletes wishing to participate in Division I or II College/University athletics after high school
- Register EARLY during freshman or sophomore year of high school with the NCAA Clearinghouse
- Student athletes will need to meet a minimum Grade Point Average, Standardized Test Score (ACT/SAT) and Core Course Requirements for DI and DII eligibility

Advanced Placement (AP) and College Credit Plus (CCP) Courses

AP Courses: (possible college credit through a test score)

- College level classes offered at the high school in a wide variety of subjects
- Students should be academically prepared and motivated
- An AP Exam is given at the end of the course in May
- Successful scores could earn you credit and/or advanced placement in college

CCP Courses: (possible college credit through a grade in the CCP course)

- College level classes offered at the high school or on college campuses
- Must meet admission standards of the participating college or university
- This includes a standardized test score (ACT) or college placement test
- Earn dual credit (both college and high school) for the grade in the CCP Class



Credits for Graduation = 21

English - 4 Credits

Math - 4 Credits

Science - 3 Credits

Social Studies - 3 Credits

Financial Lit-.5 Credit

Health - .5 Credit

Physical Education - .5 Credit

*May be waived with participation in 2 seasons of a high school sport

Fine Arts - 1 Credit

Electives - 4.5 Credits

TOTAL: 21 Credits

Scheduling for 12th Grade

- One English Class
- One Math Class
- One Science and/or Social Studies Class if still needed
- 2-3 Classes of your choice
- Be sure to schedule for 6 Classes
- Remember 6 classes for OHSAA Athletic Eligibility (PE does not count)

Early Release for Seniors Only!

Early release is available for 11th period only.

Students in the current year's graduating cohort of 2021 are eligible for early release.

Requirements:

- 2.5 GPA
- Administrative approval

Scheduling for 11th Grade

- One English Class
 - One Math Class
 - One Science Class
 - One Social Studies Class
 - Financial Literacy
 - Health and PE if needed
 - Fine Arts if needed
 - 2-3 electives of your choice

- Remember to register for 6 classes for OHSAA Athletic Eligibility

Scheduling for 10th Grade

- One English Class
 - One Math Class
 - One Science Class
 - One Social Studies Class - Automatically enrolled in World Studies
 - Health and PE if needed
 - Fine Arts if needed
 - 2-3 electives of your choice

- Remember to register for 6 classes for OHSAA Athletic Eligibility

How do I know what classes to take?

1. Talk to your teachers from this year about what to take next year
2. Teacher recommendations can be found in PowerSchool when you schedule.
3. Use the course catalog to see if prereqs are needed to get into a class. (Link below)

I need extra help with what to schedule...what can I do?

- During focus periods on 3/3 and 3/5, we will be sending out a PowerPoint to show screenshots of the scheduling screens. Your focus period teacher will walk you through the various screen of the scheduling process.
- School Counselors will be in all lunches 3/2-3/6. You can ask questions during this time.

Notes about Pathways and Electives:

- If you have started a pathway (Engineering/CISCO/Business/Medical) make sure you are scheduling classes in the correct sequence and working with your pathway teacher on recommendations
- Be sure to check pre-requisites for all electives
- Remember Health/PE/Fine Arts are required for graduation.

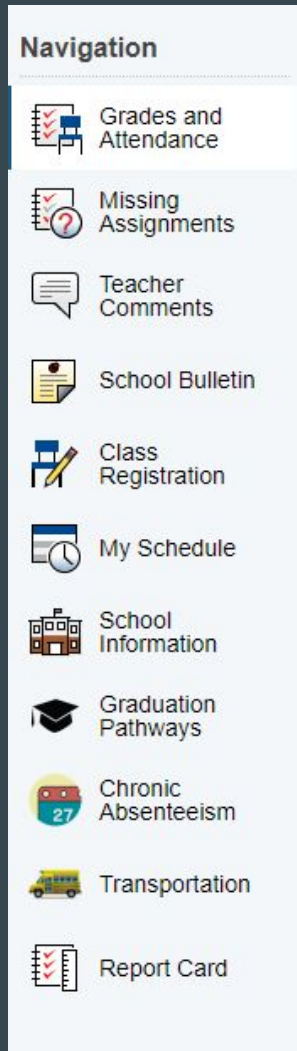
Work Based Learning Class - worth 1 credit

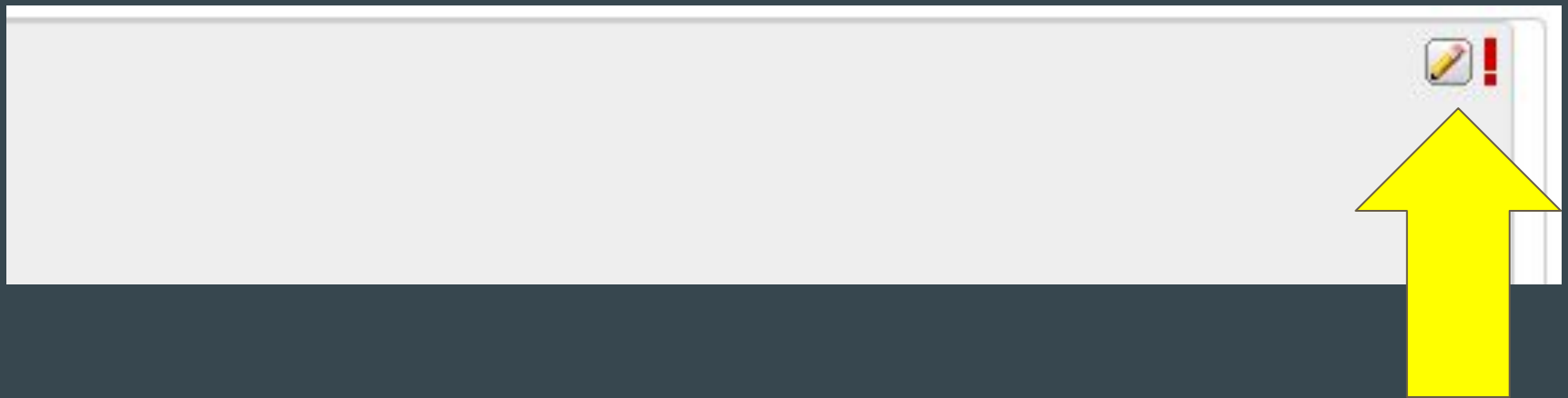

STUDY HALL

- **YOU DO NOT ENTER STUDY HALL AS A REQUEST**
- **The scheduling system will automatically fill any blank classes in your schedule with a study hall.**
 - If you want a study hall for the full year, you need to schedule 6 credits for next year
 - If you want a study hall for only a semester, you need to schedule 6.5 credits for next year.

What is the “Alternative Elective” box?

- This box allows you to choose “back-up” classes to your first choice classes for next year.
- **Fill out the Alternative Elective Box when Scheduling!!!**
 - Don't forget to fill out 2-3 alternate elective choices in case your 1st choice electives are full. Electives are filled based on seniority
(Seniors first, Juniors second, Sophomores third)

At the bottom of the screen, you will see your total number of credits. The number should be somewhere between 5.5 and 7 credits.

- Remember that Physical Education is only 0.25 credits per semester

Remember:

What do I do now?

1. Talk with parents and teachers and begin to decide what classes you will schedule for next year.
2. Starting **March 2nd**, the scheduling window will open in PowerSchool. Follow the directions in this presentation to schedule your classes for next school year.
 - a. If you have questions about what you should schedule, set up a time to meet with your counselor or talk to us during lunches in the cafeteria
3. Requests should be entered by **March 9!!**
4. In the spring, you will get a letter with your class requests for next year. This will be your last chance to change any classes! We will **NOT** be changing classes after **June 6**.
